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Section 1: General principles

1.1 Aims and Rationale

Our school uniform is designed to build a sense of identity and community while ensuring that it remains affordable and accessible for all families. In line with statutory DfE guidance, we have limited the number of compulsory branded items to ensure our uniform provides the best value for money.

Section 2: Uniform requirements

2.1 Uniform Requirements

At Oak Farm Primary School, we require **one branded item**.

- A branded Oak Farm jumper/sweatshirt (available from our designated supplier).

All other items of uniform-including shirts, trousers, skirts, and PE kits- can be purchased from any retailer to help keep costs low for families.

2.2 The uniform consists of:

- Brown sweatshirt or cardigan with school logo; Alternatively you can purchase a plain brown jumper/sweatshirt (generic versions available from high street retailers or supermarkets).
- Plain grey trousers, skirts or pinafores;
- White polo shirts with/out logo;
- Yellow check dresses or plain grey shorts during Summer Term and up to the first half of Autumn Term (weather permitting).
- Plain black shoes/or trainers (no logos) with a velcro fastening, no laces please for EYFS and KS1.

2.3 PE kit requirements

- White t-shirt
- Plain black shorts/jogging bottoms for PE
- Plain black sweatshirt
- Trainers for PE

2.4 Nursery/Reception

In addition, it would be most helpful if each child could be provided with the following items to be kept at school:

- An apron which should be long enough to cover the child's whole uniform including sleeves.

- A pair of wellies for use when the children play on the field at break times and for when they go on welly walks to the local park as part of their topic learning.

If your child is in **Reception or KS1 (Year1 /2)** Your child will also require a reading bag – These are available to purchase from Angels. We would advise you to purchase these from Angels as the bags are made from a sturdy canvas material and ensure that books borrowed from the school are transported carefully.

Section 3: Supplier details

- The branded items can be ordered online or in store through the school uniform supplier Angels situated at 317 Rayners Lane, Pinner, Middlesex HA5 5EH.

3.1 Second-Hand Uniform Provisions

To support sustainability and reduce costs, we operate a regular Second-Hand Swap Shop.

- **Location:** KS2 Playground.
- **Frequency:** Three times per year (dates will be published in the school calendar and bulletin).

Information regarding these sales is freely accessible on our school website to ensure all current and prospective parents can acquire uniforms in a timely and affordable manner.
